Thornless blackberries are perfect for homeowners to produce fruit in containers or in the garden. Blackberries are a native crop to many areas of the United States and are adapted to a wide range of environments. Unlike many fruit crops, blackberries can be grown with little to no pesticide use in the home garden.

**Media:** Well-drained, fertile, loam soil with moderate water holding capacity

**pH:** 5.5-6.5

**Fertilization:** Weekly, 10-10-10 @ 200ppm

**Water:** Keep moist

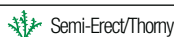

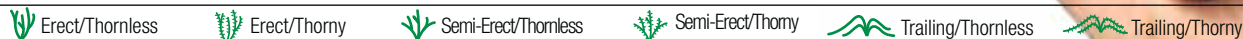

Blueberries work wonderfully in the garden, landscape or in containers on patios. Blueberry plants will produce delicious fruit and look good doing it! They make very beautiful bushes which will display brilliant Fall color. Many blueberry plants are self-fertile, however, cross pollination will help increase berry size and yield. Contact us for help on selecting the best varieties for your needs.

**Media:** Straight peat or 50/50 fine pine bark/peat

**pH:** 4.5 – 5.0


**Fertilization:** Weekly, 21-7-7 (Acid Special) @ 200ppm

**Water:** Light/frequent watering. Good drainage.

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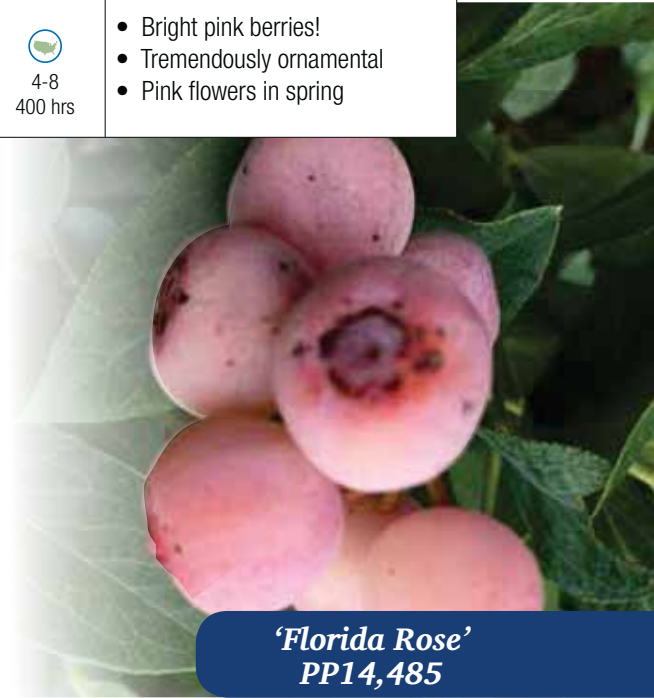

# FIG – *Ficus*



Chill 100 Hours

Figs make a welcome addition to home container gardens and landscapes. They can be grown as a tree or pruned and grown as a bush. They fruit on the current year's growth. This allows the plant to fruit even if it froze to the ground during winter months. If the plant is to be grown in cold climates it is recommended to be grown as a bush. These are all self-pollinating varieties that will fruit in containers. Fruit can be eaten out of hand, dried, baked, frozen and used in preserves.

**Media:** Good drainage, can handle minor salinity in soil and water  
**pH:** 5.5-6.5  
**Fertilization:** Weekly, 5-10-10 @ 200ppm  
**Water:** Keep moist

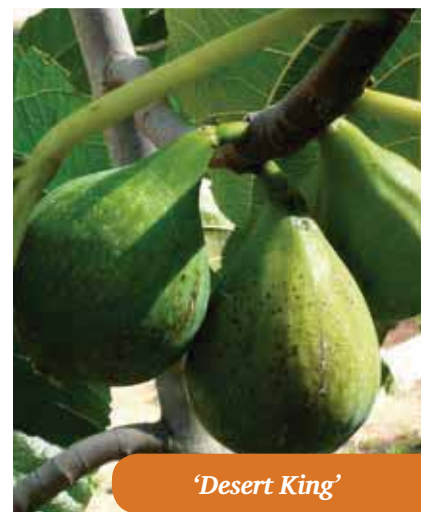

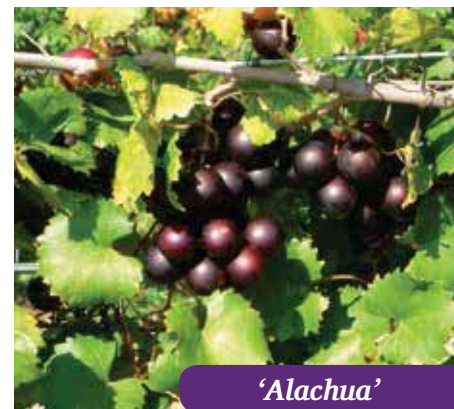

# KIWI – *Actinidia*










Actinidia is a woody vine which can cover trellises, arbors, fences, or serve as a screen for porches. The vines can be grown with very low maintenance. In order for kiwi to produce fruit you need to have a male and female plant (females produce fruit). One male can pollinate up to 8 females.

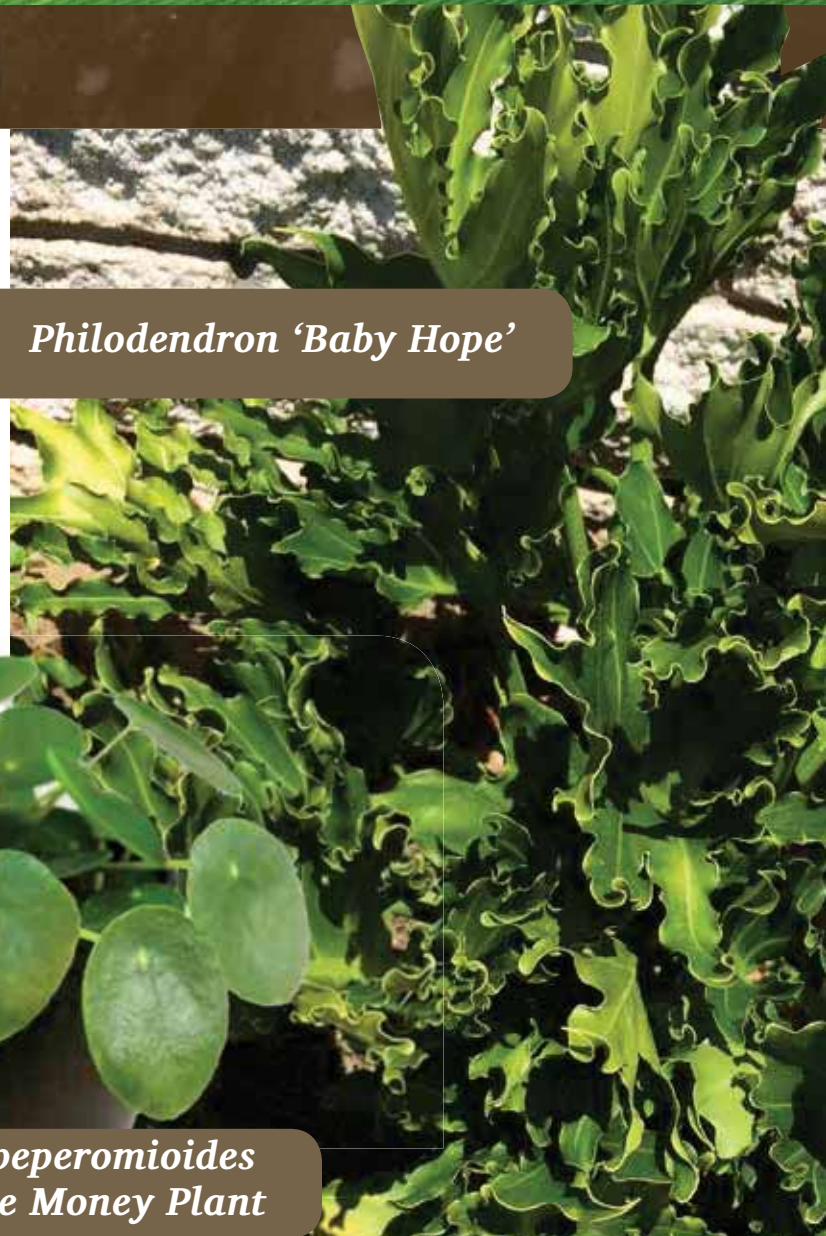

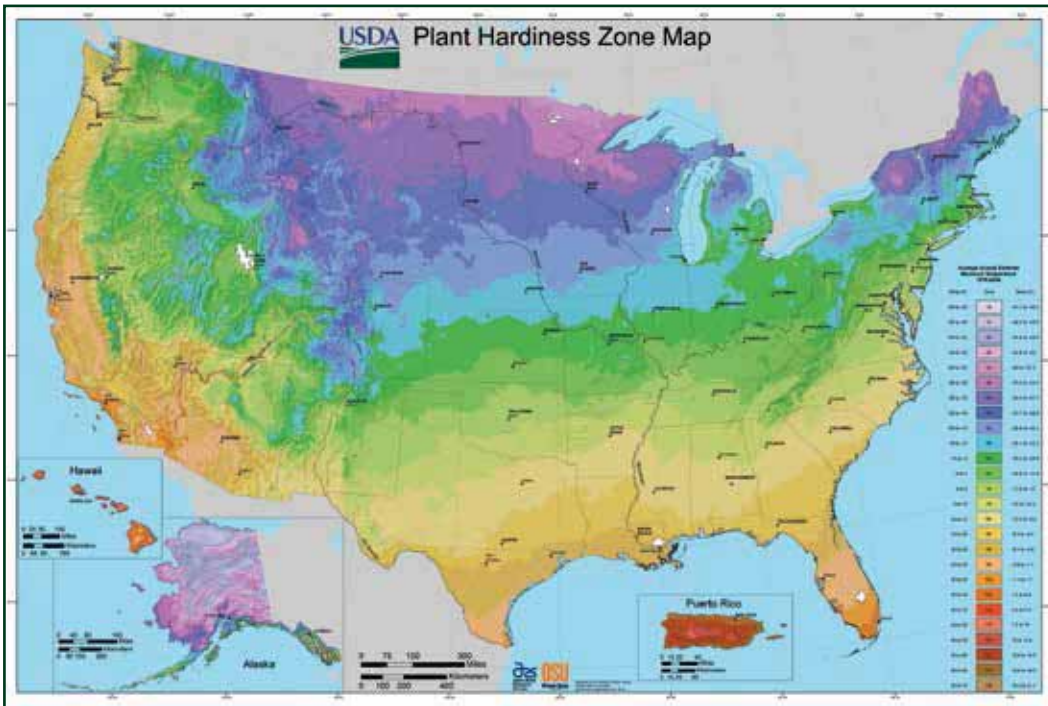
